RESOLUTION No. 847-A

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COFFEY COUNTY COMMISSIONERS AUTHORIZING PARTICIPATION IN RURAL OPPORTUNITY ZONE STUDENT LOAN REPAYMENT PROGRAM

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF COFFEY COUNTY, KANSAS,

Section 1. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 74-50,223, the Board of County Commissioners expressed its intent to participate in the Rural Opportunity Zone (ROZ) student loan repayment program.

Section 2. Coffey County has been designated a Rural Opportunity Zone pursuant to K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 74 50,222.

Section 3. Coffey County Commissioners hereby obligate Coffey County to participate in the ROZ student loan repayment program as provided by K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 74-50,223 for a period of five years, which shall be irrevocable.

Section 4. Coffey County agrees to pay in equal shares with the State of Kansas the outstanding student loan balance of any resident individual for five years, if the resident individual meets the terms of qualification provided by the State of Kansas in K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 74-50,223, and the appropriate rules and regulations. The number of qualified resident individuals receiving such payments will be subject to the availability of funds.

Section 5. Coffey County intends to enter into partnerships with Cities, Employers, and Foundations for the direct sponsorship of Rural Opportunity Zone Applicants. Sponsored Applicants must meet all qualifications of the ROZ program. All sponsorships will be subject to ROZ student loan repayment rules and regulations.

Section 6. The maximum student loan balance for each qualified resident individual to be repaid jointly by Coffey County and the State of Kansas shall be \$15,000 over a term of five years.

Section 7. Coffey County shall allocate \$0.00 a year for the purpose of matching payments from the State of Kansas to qualified resident individuals. Coffey County shall revise its ROZ budget on an annual basis and shall inform the State of Kansas of any changes to the annual allocation. Coffey County shall submit their obligation in full to the Department of Commerce before the first day of September each year.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution shall be published once in the official county newspaper and shall be in effect from and after its date of publication.

ORDINANCE NO. 330

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING COST ESTIMATES AND AUTHORIZING THE PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS TO THE MUNICIPALLY OWNED SEWER SYSTEM OF THE CITY OF GRIDLEY, COFFEY COUNTY, KANSAS, BY MAKING CERTAIN IMPROVEMENTS TO THE CITY'S SEWER SYSTEM AND DOING ALL OTHER THINGS NECESSARY AND INCIDENTAL THERETO, AUTHORIZING THE CITY TO ISSUE AND SELL THE CITY'S GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS TO FINANCE ALL OR PART OF THE COSTS THEREOF, PURSUANT TO K.S.A. 12-618 AND ALL AMENDMENTS THERETO.

WHEREAS, the City of Gridley, Coffey County, Kansas, (the "City") is a municipality as defined by K.S.A. 10-101, K.S.A. 12-618 and all amendments thereto; and

WHEREAS, the City is authorized by the laws of the State of Kansas to issue and sell General Obligation Bonds of the City for the improvement of its sewer system pursuant to K.S.A. 12-618 and all amendments thereto (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the City has not divided the City into more than one sewer district, and as such the City constitutes one sewer district, and therefore the City is exempt from the provisions of the Act in so far as providing for the levying of a tax or assessment against specific lots and pieces of property in separate sewer districts of the City; and

WHEREAS, it is deemed by the Governing Body of the City to be necessary and advisable that the City improve its sewer system by inspecting and rehabilitating or replacing, as required, certain wastewater treatment facilities, sewer mains, and manholes, and doing all things necessary and incidental thereto, (the "Project") and that the preliminary plans, specifications and estimates have been duly prepared and filed in the office of the City Clerk of said City, which estimates shows a total cost of the project to be Two Million Seven Hundred Twenty-nine Thousand Dollars (\$2,729,000); and

WHEREAS, it is found by the Governing Body that such project will not cause a duplication of existing utility services furnished by a private utility; and

WHEREAS, the total estimated cost of the Project to be paid by the City is \$1,982,000 with the balance of the estimated costs of the Project to be paid from the proceeds of one or more grants to the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF GRIDLEY, KANSAS;

Section 1. That the estimates of costs of the Project, which estimates are now on file in the office of the City Clerk of said City, in the total estimated amount of \$2,729,000 be and the same are hereby approved.

Section 2. That it is necessary and desirable that the Project be done and that general obligation bonds of the City to be issued and sold pursuant to K.S.A. 12-618, as amended and supplemented, in an amount not to exceed \$1,982,000 to pay a portion of the costs of the Project with the balance of the costs thereof to be paid as herein described. In accordance with such findings, the Project and the financing thereof all as described herein is hereby authorized and ordered to be done.

Section 3. The City both reasonably expects and intends to finance a portion of

the costs of the Project from the proceeds of general obligation bonds of the City. The City does hereby express its official intent to reimburse any such pre-issuance original expenditures (as defined in Treas. Reg. 1.150-2(c)) made by it on or after the date which is 60 days before the date of this Ordinance from the proceeds of such bonds in the estimated maximum principal amount of \$1,982,000. The City will issue such bonds for such purposes and make the reimbursements within eighteen (18) months after the date the expenditure to be reimbursed was paid or, if later, eighteen (18) months after the date on which the property resulting from the expenditure was placed in service. Provided, that, in any event, the City must make the reimbursement allocation within three (3) years after the date the expenditure was paid. This Ordinance, as the expression of the governing body's official intent regarding the matters described herein, will be available for public inspection in the City Clerk's office at City Hall during regular business hours of the City.

Section 4. That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its adoption and publication in the official City newspaper.

Amber Alert Awareness

TOPEKA — Kansas Attorney General Derek Schmidt and KBI Director Kirk Thompson remind Kansans to stay alert when the public's assistance is needed to help locate missing children. The reminder comes as National Amber Alert Awareness Day was observed Monday, Jan. 13.

"When a child is abducted, getting detailed information about the incident out to the public as quickly as possible can be critical," Schmidt said.

Since its inception in 1996, this national program has successfully brought 977 children home safely. In Kansas, 50 children have been safely returned since 2002.

The Kansas Amber Alert system is coordinated by the Kansas Attorney General's Office and the KBI. When an alert is issued, the media are notified to begin broadcasting details of the missing child and suspect.
