Two bids were received for city building and roof repairs. The council unanimously approved the bid for roof and building repairs from Alpha Roofing for Options 1, 2 and 3 for a total amount of \$7,180.

Parkey had hand-outs for the council to review regarding a work list from Jan. 16 and corresponding responses. In summary, a pump quote was received for \$20,277.25, which did not include supplying or installing any electrical parts. More information is needed from Douglas Pump Service for additional cost of starter and electrical work.

County Engineer

County Engineer Wayne Blackburn told commissioners the highway department is repairing erosion and rock entrances this week at designated locations. With the weather warming up and drying gravel roads, crews have been shaping roads and adding rock as needed. Other work includes ditch cleaning, brush and tree removal at various locations.

A road permit was issued to Westar Energy to install 34.5/12KV overhead power lines along the north side of Old Hwy. 50 and remove overhead power lines along the south side of Old Hwy. 50, from Garner to Kafir Road.

Commissioners approved Blackburn's recommendation to solicit sealed bids for five hot mix asphalt projects:

- A2001-C, approximately four miles of 1.5" hot mix (26" width) overlay on Shetland Road, 12th Road to 16th Road.

- A2002-C, approximately four miles of 1.5" hot mix (26" width) overlay on 13th Road, Lynx Road to U.S. 75; Lynx Road, 12th Road to 14th Road; 12th Lane, Lynx Road to Lynx Lane; and Lynx Lane, 12th Lane to 13th Road.

- A2003-C, approximately three miles of 1.5" hot mix (26" width) overlay on Trefoil Road, 22nd Road to 25th Road.

- A2004-C, milling and 2" hot mix overlay at California Road and K-58 Hwy. intersection.
- A2005-C, milling and 2" hot mix overlay at Shetland Road and Old Hwy. 50 intersection.

Commissioners also approved Blackburn's request to solicit formal bids for approximately 15,000 tons of filter rock (rock passing the 3" screen and retained on a 1" screen) as needed for the construction of county landfill cell #4, project LF 2001-C.

Executive Sessions

Commissioners met in two 10-minute executive sessions with County Counselor Wade Bowie II. The first executive session, using the nonelected personnel exception to Kansas Open Meetings Act, was to protect the privacy rights of non-elected personnel. The second executive session, using the attorney-client relationship exception to KOMA, was to consult the county counselor regarding ongoing litigation.

Miscellaneous

Coffey County Health Administrator Lindsay Payer informed commissioners she will not be applying for a \$6,000 child care licensing grant through Kansas Department of Health and Environment. Payer said for more than 15 years Coffey County has contracted with Lyon County to provide child licensing services. KDHE plans to regionalize
