Wolves drop heartbreaker to South Central, 41-38

DODGE CITY — For a second year in a row, the Lebo Wolves played a close game in the quarterfinal round of the 2020 Class 1A State boys' basketball tournament, and for a second year in a row, they came up three points short of the victory.

The Wolves played a tight game with Coldwater's South Central Timberwolves in the quarterfinals Wednesday, March 11, at United Wireless Arena in Dodge City. The Wolves were down only three points, 10-7, after the first quarter. In the second quarter, they were again edged, 12-10, and they were on the short end of a 22-17 halftime score.

Returning to the court for the second half, the Wolves found some momentum and topped South Central by two points in the third quarter. However, they were unable to complete the comeback in the final quarter, when both teams traded points and each added 11 points to their score. Lebo finished three points shy of the win, 41-38. The loss came a year after the Wolves fell to Osborne in the 2019 state quarterfinals, 44-41.

South Central's Xavier Frazier led all scorers with 23 points. Teammates Owen Alexander and Gage Girk put up 8 and six points, respectively.

Devan McEwen was the only Lebo player to reach double digits in scoring, finishing with 14 points. Landon Grimmatt contributed eight points. Kaden Ott chipped in seven.

In other stats for the Wolves,


Jerome Ferguson and Kyle Reese each pulled down three rebounds. Ott, McEwen, Grimmatt, Andrew Bailey and Luke Davies each caught two rebounds and Jonas Konrade took one. Bailey made three assists, while McEwen and Reese each made two and Ott and Ferguson each made one. McEwen and Reese each had two steals, and Ott, Grimmatt and Davies each had one. Ott had all of the team's three blocks.

As a team, the Wolves made 11 of 38 (28.9 percent) of their field goals, including five of 20 (25 percent) of their three-pointers, and sank 11 of 18 (61.1 percent) of their free throws. They came away with 21 (38.89 percent) of 54 rebounds, including 14 of 21 (66.67 percent) of South Central's and seven of 33 (21.21 percent) of their own. They also made nine assists, seven steals and three blocks while committing 18 fouls and 15 turnovers.

South Central made 15 of 32 (46.9 percent) of their field goals, including two of eight (25 percent) of their three-pointers, and bucketed nine of 16 (56.3 percent) of their free throws. They caught 33 (61.11

percent) of 54 rebounds, including 26 of 33 (78.79 percent) of Lebo's and seven of 21 (33.33 percent) of their own. They also made six assists, 10 steals and one block while committing 19 fouls and 21 turnovers.

The Wolves ended their season 22-4 record. Following the conclusion of the quarterfinal rounds, the remainder of both the boys' and girls' state tournament for all classifications was canceled due to the threat of the novel coronavirus. No semifinal or placement games were played. South Central

finished its season with a 21-5 record.

This parcel is 160 acres more or less and has also had continuous improvement since purchase with prescribed burns and application of PastureGard. There's a diverse income stream here between CRP, oil production, Native hay meadow and cropland. The 74.9 acre CRP contract expires in 2025 and the buyer can transition into whatever best fits their program or possibly re-enroll. There's approximately 50 acres of high-quality Native meadow and a 16.41 acre field of old-stand alfalfa ready to be transitioned back to tillable. This parcel also has a tremendous quail population if you're a recreational buyer looking for income.
