Cornine, Burlington, criminal damage to property without consent - value less than \$1,000 (class B misdemeanor). 20CR76 (5-27-20) State of Kansas vs. Dakota J. Adams, Topeka, possession of marijuana upon a roadway (class B misdemeanor), possession of drug paraphernalia (class B misdemeanor), speeding 80/65 (traffic infraction). Case action: 19CR132 (5-26-20) Martise Harrison, Topeka, pleaded no contest to possession of drug paraphernalia (class B misdemeanor). The court found him guilty and sentenced Harrison to serve 90 days in the county jail, which was suspended in lieu of six months of unsupervised probation. Harrison must also pay a \$100 fine and pay \$158 court costs and \$35 fingerprint fee. One count possession of marijuana upon a roadway (class B misdemeanor) was dismissed. 20CR19 (5-26-20) Deborah M. Alvarado, Burlington, pleaded guilty to amended counts of possession of marijuana and possession of drug paraphernalia, both class B misdemeanors. She was sentenced to serve an underlying six months in the county jail on

count 1 and six months in jail on count 2, to run consecutively. She was granted 12 months of supervised probation on each count. Alvarado must pay \$158 court costs, \$35 fingerprint fee, \$100 BIDS fee and \$60 supervision fee. She must also obtain a drug and alcohol evaluation. 20CR35 (5-26-20) Deborah M. Alvarado, Burlington, pleaded guilty to violate protection order - condition of pretrial orders (class A misdemeanor). She was sentenced to serve six months in the county jail, which was suspended in favor of 12 months of supervised probation, to run concurrent with 20CR19. Alvarado must pay \$158 court costs, \$35 fingerprint fee and \$60 supervision fee. A condition of probation includes no contact with victim.

ORDINANCE NO. 2020-01

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING 2020 SALARIES FOR THE APPOINTED AND ELECTED OFFICIALS OF THE CITY OF NEW STRAWN, KANSAS AND THE REPEAL OF ORDINANCE NO. 2019-03.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF NEW STRAWN, KANSAS:

SECTION 1: SALARIES. The following elected and appointed officials of the City of New Strawn shall receive as compensation for their services in the amount set opposite their titles for the period mentioned:
