Southern Lyon County USD 252: BOE rejects bus bids

HARTFORD — President Kevin Flott called the regular meeting of the Southern Lyon County USD 252 Board of Education to order 11 a.m. May 13 at the BOE Office in Hartford. Present for the meeting were Jon Breshears, Emily Darbyshire, Gene Windle, Superintendent Michael Argabright and Clerk Cassie Dieker. Attending via ZOOM was Steve Redeker. No visitors attended in person but several were present on ZOOM, including Joyce Wilson, Carol Wilson, Roy Crawford, Linda Crawford, Doug Hes, Shane Clark and Jennifer Smith.

and Analia Fegan as summer workers, Jacob Argabright and Ryker Schmidt as summer technology workers. Argabright reported the district's enrollment is projected to decline for the 2020-21 school year. He also announced the 2019 Challenge Awards in recognition of outstanding achievement and uncommon accomplishments based on Kansas assessment results in math and reading, graduation rates, chronic absenteeism rates, and socio-economic states of those taking the test. An award ceremony will be scheduled for Neosho Rapids Elementary at a later date. Argabright extended congratulations to Mr. Hes and staff.

Pictures of other cement needs were presented of the Neosho Rapids bus drop off area. Argabright presented the bus bids received on April 17. After discussion with administrators, he recommended rejecting all bus bids and focus on replacing or adding vehicles to the current fleet, to include possible transit vehicles, vans and cars. The board unanimously approved rejecting the bid and concurred with the recommendation to focus on replacing or adding vehicles. Principals presented a second parent, student and staff survey on the Continuous Learning Plan. Results were very similar to the first survey conducted. Argabright discussed working on competency based delivery and professional development if virtual learning continues to be needed in the future. Summer school plans have been made for different scenarios depending on restrictions by Lyon County Health Department Officials.

Increases in 2020-21 employee insurance rates, anticipated budget challenges, negotiations and information on CARES Act funding available to the district were on the financial reports presented by Superintendent Michael Argabright. The board moved into executive session for 15 minutes via private Zoom link to discuss personnel pursuant to non-elected personnel exception under KOMA with the Board and Superintendent present. After return to open meeting, Argabright recommended accepting the following resignations: Ryan Thomas as the Hartford Junior High girls basketball coach and Larry Bess as the Hartford Junior High School football coach, both effective immediately.

Argabright announced USD 252 has received recognition from KSDE for meeting the requirements for all 14 State Performance Plan District-Level Indicators. He extended congratulations to Julianna Schmid and her staff. He also announced The Children's Cabinet has funded the early childhood block grant for the 2020-21 school year. The district was awarded \$288,000 toward its three to five-year-old program and an additional \$50,451 for its birth to three-year-old program. He extended congratulations to Laura Evins and her staff.

The board approved the amended dates for graduation ceremonies to June 20 with an alternate date of July 25 as allowed by the Lyon County Health Department. The Consent Agenda item OPAA Food Management Contract (food service) was pulled for further discussion. Items approved on the consent agenda included: Minutes from April 8 regular meeting and April 30 special meeting. Bills due and payable - \$249,439.54. Payrolls for April 10, April 24 and May 8 - \$493,039.90. Pledged securities, journal entries, district goals update, SLCEF account balances, and petty cash and activity account reports. "Ingress" is the right or permission to use a path or right-of-way over which a person may ENTER or go across adjoining land to reach his own property. An "egress" is the right to a path or right-of-way over which a person may LEAVE or go away from his own property. These terms are most often used on easements for oil and gas leases, water, sewer and gas lines, when the company operating the lease or equipment must cross adjoining land to get to their location.
