# Jarvis wins Wellsville Invitational boys' race

WELLSVILLE — The Burlington High School cross country team was in action at the Wellsville Invitational Thursday, Sept. 17.

Seth Jarvis, who has come out of the blocks his senior year determined to set new standards for Burlington runners and area meets, won the Wellsville meet's boys' race by 31 seconds. He ran the race in 17 minutes 38 seconds, averaging 5:40 a mile on a tough winding course. Last week, he had finished fourth in a quality meet in Hesston, cracking the 17 minute barrier by running 16:53.

Also off to an excellent start is senior Brian Payer, who had a quality run at Wellsville and finished seventh overall in 19:00. Eli Crutchfield medaled and finished 12th overall

in 19:36. He was followed by Tucker Wright, 25th in 20:49; Braedon Berkenmeier, 26th in 20:50; Ty Anderson, 27th in 20:54; and John Howard, 33rd in 21:18.

Overall, the Burlington team finished third with 58 points. Winning the meet was Louisville with 46 points, with West Franklin second with 47. Santa Fe Trail was fourth with 87 points and Wellsville fifth with 95.

"It was thrilling to see Seth Jarvis have such a strong run," Burlington coaches Bart Kuhlmann and Julie Dawson said. "He has worked incredibly hard and it is paying off for him. Brian has run very well in his two meets also. Eli keeps improving, and we have a group of six boys fighting for the other four positions on var-

sity. Tucker continues to hold the fourth runner spot, with Braedon, Ty, John, Bryce Lee and Tyler Kirkby competing for the fifth, sixth and seventh spots."

In the girls' race, with top runner Lillyan Gerow sitting out the meet with an injury, M.J. Huff ran a beautiful race in a tough competitive group, medaling in sixth place overall in a time of 23:18. Senior Myka Watkins was 20th, earning the medal in a time of 25:32. Aleesia Hernandez came in 26th for the Lady Wildcats in 26:44. E'owynn Reynard was Burlington's fourth runner, coming in 27th in 27:46, and Paige Akers completed Burlington's score, finishing 30th overall in 30:00.

The girls' team scores included Louisville with 25 points, Santa Fe Trail with 43,

Prairie View with 79 and Burlington with 86.

"It was tough for the girls on Thursday," Dawson and Kuhlmann said. "They found out Lillyan would not be running with them about five minutes before the start. That is tough when she has done so well for us. We were proud of how hard they tried, with seniors Myka Watkins and Aleesia Hernandez stepping up. M.J. keeps getting better and better, along with E'owynn and Paige."

In the junior varsity races at Wellsville, Tyler Kirkby had his best run, coming in second overall in 20:59. Freshman Bryce Lee also medaled for the Wildcats, coming in fourth in 21:39. Other runners included Elliott Burns with

his best run of the season in 13th in 23:22, Dakota Kirkby in 15th in 23:47, Briton Garland in 18th in 24:51, Cooper Carlson in 22nd in 26:53, Decovin Plummer in 23rd in 27:57 and Parker Parsons in 25th in 29:22. Sierra Haddock was the lone female JV runner, and she completed the course in 12th place, with a time of 35:33.

Rim Rock Farm is not hosting their yearly (nationally open) high school cross country run this year. As a result, Burlington and Osage City combined efforts to put on a similar run Saturday, Sept. 26, at Crawford Farms north of Lebo. It will be a challenging course, and 10 schools will be involved. JV races will begin at 9 a.m.

## Hartford athletes compete in Karr Classic

EMPORIA — Nine members of the Hartford junior high and high school cross country team made a short journey to The Orchard, near Emporia, to compete in Northern Heights High School's Karr Classic Thursday, Sept. 17.

Lone varsity runner Madison Miller competed in the girls' varsity race. She placed 25th with a time of 27 minutes 10 seconds.

In the girls' JV race, Kira Westhoff came in fifth in 28:18. In the boys' JV race, Ben Westhoff placed second, finishing the race in 22:51.

"The kids had an awesome meet Thursday," Hartford coach Tammy Windle said. "We had a lot of personal best

times."

Hartford had runners in each of the junior high races. Cody Cleveland took second place in the eighth-grade boys' race with a time of 12:41. In the eighth-grade girls' race, Trinity Windle and Mackenzie Kelley came in fifth and seventh in 15:43 and 16:54, respectively. For the seventh-graders, Emma Westhoff finished 15th in 18:59 in the girls' race and Jackson Hes and Landon Schultz came in 14th and 15th in 18:33 and 19:05, respectively, in the boys' race.

Hartford's runners will next compete in the West Franklin Invitational at Camp Chippewa Thursday, Sept. 24, with races beginning at 4 p.m.

At Hartford, the Lebo Lady Wolves picked up two wins. They defeated Heritage Christian Academy in a three-set match, 19-25, 27-25, 25-23. They went on to top Hartford in two sets, 25-8, 25-12. Hartford also took a loss to Heritage Christian Academy, 12-25, 17-25.

Waverly split at Olpe. The Lady Bulldogs took a tough loss to Olpe, 9-25, 16-25, but

rebounded to top Madison, 25-20, 25-12.

SCC played a best-of-five match against Burlington. The Lady Titans came up short in three sets, 15-25, 6-25, 20-25. Leading in kills for SCC were Josie Weers with 13, Ross Snovelle with six and Jalea True with three and in blocks were Weers with six, Madaline Spencer with four and Snovelle with three. Callie Johnson had 13 assists and Spencer 11. Leaders in digs were Emersyn Hall with six, Taryn Lather with two and Spencer, Weers, Johnson and Kyra Ohl with one each. Ohl had the team's only ace serve.

### Lebo outplays Waverly, improves to 3-0

Lyon County League football action Friday night, Sept. 18, saw the Lebo Wolves improve to 3-0 with a big win over the Waverly Bulldogs, while the Hartford Jaguars and Southern Coffey County Titans both took tough losses.

At Waverly, Lebo built a 46-6 lead over Waverly by half-time and was the first team to reach the end zone in the third quarter, thus ending the game via the 45-point mercy rule. Lebo won, 52-6.

Lebo quarterback Devan McEwen was 12 for 15 through the air for 229 yards and five touchdowns. Leading receivers were Luke Davies with four catches for 121 yards and a touchdown, Kyle Reese with four catches for 54 yards and three touchdowns, Connor Kiefer with a catch for 21 yards and Jerome Ferguson with a catch for 16 yards and a touchdown.

On the ground, McEwen gained 59 yards and a touchdown on four carries. Reese picked up 15 yards on two carries.

The Wolves scored on five of seven point after touchdown attempts. McEwen scored three rushing two-point conversions. Ferguson and Landon Grimmer each caught a short toss from McEwen to score a passing two-point conversion.

For Waverly, Damian Foster was six for 11 passing for 73 yards. Leading receivers included Lane Bartley with three catches for 46 yards, Koy Myers with two catches for 25 yards and Michael Lehmann with a catch for two yards.

Leading in the ground game were Foster with 14 carries for 56 yards, Lehmann with 13 carries for 33 yards and a touchdown and Myers with a

carry for three yards.

Defensive leaders for Lebo included Reese with six solo and three assisted tackles, Davies and Caleb Fehr with four solos and three assists each and Austin Bailey with three solos. Reese had the team's only sack and tackle for a loss of yards.

For the Waverly defense, Foster and Brady Wallace each had a solo tackle. Ben Meehan made an interception.

At LeRoy, the SCC Titans had a challenging game against Madison. The Titans were able to reach the end zone only once and took the loss, 53-6, after two quarters. The touchdown came on a 24-yard pass from Brayton Lind to Mitchyl Walters.

At Burlingame, Hartford also had a tough game. After scoring once in the first quarter, the Jaguars were unable to score again and took the loss, 54-6, after three quarters. The only touchdown came on a pass from Ali Smith to Tanner Highley.

All four teams will next play 7 p.m. Friday, Sept. 25. Lebo will return home to host Hartford, and SCC will host Waverly.

## Sites announced for state cross country meets

TOPEKA — The Kansas State High School Activities Association will utilize three sites for state cross country meets to be held on Saturday, Oct. 31, including two new championship venues. Consistent with risk mitigation efforts, a third site was added to reduce the number of runners at each venue and allow for more time between races.

Once again, Wamego will welcome championship racing. The Class 4A and 3A state meet will be held at Wamego Country Club and hosted by Wamego High School. The Burlington Wildcats compete in Class 3A.

The Class 2A and 1A state meet will be held at Sand Plum Nature Trail in Victoria. Victoria High School will serve as the member school host and will be supported by the athletic department of Fort Hays State University for this championship event.

The Class 6A and 5A state meet will be held at 4 Mile Creek Resort in Augusta. Andover High School will be the host, with Wichita State University supporting the effort with course preparation. WSU is very familiar with this course, as the 4 Mile Creek Resort (formerly known as RAFT) is the home course for the Shockers.

For the first time since 1992, Rim Rock Farm is not available as one of the championship sites as the University of Kansas has notified the KSHSAA that the venue is not open

for high school events this fall.

Regionals will be held on Saturday, Oct. 24, at sites that will soon be finalized. Class 4A, 5A and 6A will each have four regional sites of eight or nine assigned schools. Class 2A and 3A will have six regional sites of 10 or 11 schools assigned. Class 1A will have three regional sites.

"The health and safety of our students continues to be the most important factor in the changes we have implemented with postseason competitions and we are pleased to expand to another venue for these championship meets," said Bill Faflick, KSHSAA Executive Director. "Certainly, we are fortunate to have quality courses and dedicated hosts to provide the best experience possible for our student-athletes."
