ORDINANCE 587

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING WATER RATES FOR THE CITY OF LEO, KANSAS, AND REPEALING ORDINANCE 574 OF THE CITY OF LEO, KANSAS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF LEO, KANSAS

SECTION 1. Residential and commercial customer water rates within the city limits of the City of Lebo. The following rates shall be charged and collected for water furnished within the city limits of the City of Lebo:

a. A monthly service charge of \$25.00 per dwelling unit served by a meter. The initial 1,000 gallons of water furnished or any part thereof shall be included in the monthly service charge of \$25.00.

b. A charge of \$9.25 will be assessed for every 1,000 gallons of water in excess of the initial 1,000 gallons.

SECTION 2. Rural residential and commercial customer water rates. The following rates shall be charged and collected for water furnished outside the city limits of the City of Lebo:

a. A monthly service charge of \$35.00 per dwelling unit served by a meter. The initial 1,000 gallons of water furnished or any part thereof shall be included in the monthly service charge of \$35.00.

b. A charge of \$10.00 will be assessed for every 1,000 gallons of water in excess of the initial 1,000 gallons.

SECTION 3. Industrial customer water rates within the city limits of the City of Lebo. Industrial customers are defined as a customer whose average monthly usage is above 100,000 gallons a month. The following rates shall be charged and collected for water furnished to industrial customers within the city limits of the City of Lebo.

a. A charge of \$9.00 will be assessed for every 1,000 gallons of water for the first 10,000 gallons

b. A charge of \$8.25 will be assessed for every 1,000 gallons of water for the next 90,000 gallons

c. A charge of \$7.25 will be assessed for every 1,000 gallons of water for the next 150,000 gallons

d. A charge of \$6.25 will be assessed for every 1,000 gallons of water above 250,000 gallons

SECTION 4. Master water meter monthly service charge. Any water meter providing

water to more than one dwelling shall be considered a master water meter. The following monthly service charge shall apply to any master water meter located on the City of Lebo water distribution lines.

a. A monthly service charge of \$50.00 per master water meter. The initial 1,000 of water furnished or any part there of shall be included in the monthly service charge of \$50.00

b. The charge for every 1,000 gallon of water in excess of the initial 1,000 shall be set in contract with the City of Lebo as approved by the Lebo City Council.

SECTION 5. Bulk water rates. The following rates shall be charged and collected for water furnished by the city in bulk to contractors and individuals.

a. An initial set up charge of \$35.00 shall be charged for the first 1,000 gallons.

b. A charge of \$10.00 will be assessed for every 1,000 gallons of water in excess of the initial 1,000 gallons.

SECTION 6. Ordinance 574 is hereby repealed.

SECTION 7. This ordinance shall take effect upon publication in the official City Newspaper.

ORDINANCE NO. 588

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING CHARGES AND FEES FOR THE USE AND SERVICE OF THE SEWER SYSTEM OF THE CITY OF LEO, KANSAS AND REPEALING ORDINANCE 575 OF THE CITY OF LEO, KANSAS.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF LEO, KANSAS:

SECTION 1. The following rates are hereby established for the use of and service supplied by the sewer system of the City of Lebo, Kansas, a. A minimum monthly charge of \$19.00 for service.

b. Thereafter \$0.80 per every 1,000 gallons or part of 1,000 gallons of water utilized over the initial 1,000 gallons of water per month.

SECTION 2. Ordinance 575 is hereby repealed

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall take effect upon publication in the official City newspaper.
