BHS cross country qualifies four for state

GARNETT — The Burlington High School cross country team competed in a Class 3A Regional meet at Garnett Country Club in Garnett Saturday, Oct. 24. With the BHS girls' team finishing fourth overall and the boys' team finishing third, Burlington cross country did not qualify teams to participate in the Class 3A State championships this year. However, four Burlington runners did qualify as individuals.

The individual qualifiers who placed high enough at regionals at Garnett to qualify for state are, for the girls, M.J. Huff, who finished seventh overall in 22 minutes 29.7 seconds, and Lillyan Gerow, who placed second overall in the 5K race by running 21:32. In the boys' race, Brian Payer qualified for state as he ran one of the best races of his career and came in seventh overall in a time of 18:27. The winner of the Garnett Regional is Seth Jarvis of BHS, who claimed the regional championship in a time of 17:04. This is the second straight year Jarvis has won the regional

In the girls' team race, it was a gritty effort by the Burlington girls, as scores were tight with Prairie View scoring 117, Burlington 77, Perry Lecompton 73, Santa Fe trail 54 and Anderson County winning the meet with 40.

Following Gerow and Huff, senior Myka Watkins had a very strong, determined effort, running the hilly course in 24:34 for 22nd place. As with Jarvis and Payer, Watkins has been in cross country since seventh grade. Following Myka were senior Aleesia Hernandez, coming in a solid 33rd in 26:21.0; newcomer Makaylia Wilson, a junior, placing 34th in 26:25.9; and juniors E'owynn Codney, 37th in 27:07.7, and Paige Akers, 44th in 28:33.2.

For the boy's, it was a heartbreaker as a team third-place finish was just short of qualification as the State meet only takes the top two teams out of the regional's 11 schools. Scores for the boys meet were Wellsville with 142, Santa Fe Trail with 103, West Franklin 76, Burlington 71, Perry-Lecompton 57 and, winning the meet, Anderson Country boys with 48 points.

He was followed by Ty Anderson having one of his best runs of the season and coming in 26th in 19:46.7. Sophomore Tucker Wright completed a strong season, finishing 28th in 19:59.0. Freshman Bryce Lee had a good effort, coming in 33rd


