match. The match was a thriller that was close until the end. Lebo dropped the first set, 25-27, but battled back to claim the second set, 25-22, and force a third set. In the third and final set, Lebo edged Burlingame, 27-25, to claim the match win. With the victory, the Lady Wolves were named the substate champions.

As substate champion, the Lady Wolves advance to state-level play. Due to COVID-19, state quarterfinal matches were held Tuesday, Oct. 27. For their match, the Lady Wolves hosted Centralia. Lebo entered the match with a 29-3 record, while Centralia entered with a 23-10 record. Lebo won the match in five sets, 22-25, 25-22, 25-20, 9-25, 15-9. As a quarter-

final match winner, the Lady Wolves advance to the Class 1A Division I State tournament to be held Saturday, Oct. 31, at United Wireless Arena in Dodge City. Matches will begin at 10:45 a.m.

The Hartford Lady Jaguars, SCC Lady Titans and Waverly Lady Bulldogs all played in a Class 1A Division II Substate tournament at LeRoy. In the only quarterfinal match, Hartford, seeded No. 5 with a 6-19 record, played No. 4-seeded Marais des Cygnes Valley (7-21). The Lady Jaguars fell in one of the two matches. SCC edged Waverly, 25-23, 25-19. The Lady Bulldogs end their season with a 9-19 record. In the other semifinal match, top-seeded Marmaton Valley (17-11) bested MdCV, 25-16, 25-11.

SCC and Marmaton Valley faced off in the championship match. The match went to three sets but SCC came up short, 25-21, 20-25, 25-22.

On the day for SCC, leaders in kills were Josie Weers with
