Raymond was fined \$500 and ordered to pay \$158 court costs, \$60 supervision fee and \$35 fingerprint fee. One count criminal damage to property (class B misdemeanor) was dismissed.
 19CR93 (6-18-20) Bradley S. Fischer Jr., LeRoy, pleaded no contest to burglary - non-dwelling to commit felony or theft (level 7 non-person felony) and was sentenced to serve an underlying 16 months in prison. Fischer was also sentenced on two counts theft of property or services - value \$1,500 to \$25,000 (level 9 nonperson felony). The charges stem from the July 21, 2019 burglary of Victory Excavating in New Strawn and the theft of tools and a welder.

before. Fifteen provisional ballots were cast by people who had requested mail ballots but they ended up voting in person. Other provisional ballots were due to name changes, replaced mail ballots due to not receiving the original ballots, two address issues and one person who voted by mail, but died before Election Day.

The majority of voters casting provisional ballots were voters who had not registered prior to the election.

Kirchner went over the poll book totals, which were inspected by the board. She said 592 mail ballots were received.
