

Council OKs tower space, sewer project

NEW STRAWN — The New Strawn City Council met Tuesday, Nov. 24, for a 25-minute special meeting.

On a 2-1 vote, the council approved hiring Cook's Plumbing and Schmidt Excavating to complete a sewer improvement project on Neosho Street, not to exceed \$37,600. Haehn opposed the motion.

Dwight gave an update on CARES projects in the city.

The council unanimously approved a lease agreement

for tower space with JMZ Corp., dba Kwikom.

The council also voted to allow the city clerk to purchase a fireproof file cabinet, not to exceed \$1,100.

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING PUBLIC OFFENSES WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF LEBO, KANSAS; INCORPORATING BY REFERENCE THE "UNIFORM PUBLIC OFFENSE CODE FOR KANSAS CITIES," 36TH EDITION, AND REPEALING OR-

DINANCE NO. 582 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF LEBO, KANSAS:

SECTION 1. INCORPORATING UNIFORM PUBLIC OFFENSE CODE. There is hereby incorporated by reference for the purpose of regulating public offenses within the corporate limits of the City of Lebo, Kansas that certain code known as "Uniform Public Offense Code", 36th Edition, prepared and published in book form by the League of Kansas Municipalities, Topeka, Kansas. One copy of said Uniform Public Offense Code shall be marked or stamped "Official Copy as Adopted by Ordinance No. 585", and to which shall be attached a copy of this ordinance, and filed with the City Clerk to be open to inspection and available to the public at all reasonable hours.

SECTION 2. REPEAL. Ordinance No. 582 is hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the official city newspaper.

ORDINANCE 586

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING TRAFFIC WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF LEBO, KANSAS; INCORPORATING BY REFERENCE THE "STANDARD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE FOR KANSAS CITIES" 47TH EDITION, WITH CERTAIN ADDITIONS; PRESCRIBING ADDITIONAL REGULATION; PROVIDING CERTAIN PENALTIES AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 581.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF LEBO, KANSAS:

SECTION 1. INCORPORATING STANDARD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE.

There is hereby incorporated by reference for the purpose of regulating traffic within the corporate limits of the City of Lebo, Kansas that certain standard traffic ordinance known as "Standard Traffic Ordinance for Kansas Cities" 47th Edition, prepared and published in book form by the League of Kansas Municipalities, Topeka, Kansas. One copy of said Standard Traffic Ordinance shall be marked or stamped "Official Copy as Adopted by Ordinance No. 586", and to which shall be attached a copy of this ordinance, and filed with the City Clerk to be open to inspection and available to the public at all reasonable hours. The police department, municipal judge and all administrative departments of the city charged with enforcement of the ordinance shall be supplied, at the cost of the city, such number of official copies of such Standard Traffic Ordinance similarly marked, as may be deemed expedient.

SECTION 2. TRAFFIC INFRACTIONS AND TRAFFIC OFFENSES.

a) An ordinance traffic infraction is a violation of any section of this ordinance that prescribes or requires the same behavior as that prescribes or requires by a statutory provision that is classified as a traffic infraction in K.S.A. 8-2118. b) All traffic violations which are included within this ordinance, and which are not ordinance traffic infractions as defined in subsection (a) of this section, shall be considered traffic offenses.

SECTION 3. Section 88 of said standard traffic ordinance is hereby changed to read as follows:

Section 88. Parking for Certain Purposes Prohibited.

No person shall park a vehicle upon any roadway or in any public parking lot for the principal purpose of:

- (a) Displaying such vehicle for sale.
- (b) Washing, greasing, or repairing such vehicle, except repairs necessitated by an emergency.

SECTION 4. PENALTY FOR SCHEDULED FINES.

The fine for violation of an ordinance traffic infraction or any other traffic offense for which the municipal judge established a fine in a fine schedule shall not be less than \$10.00 or more than \$200.00 except for speeding. A person tried and convicted for violation of an ordinance traffic infraction or other traffic offense for which a fine has been established in a schedule of fines shall pay a fine fixed by the court not to exceed \$500.00.

SECTION 5. REPEAL. Ordinance No. 581 is hereby repealed.

SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE

DATE. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the official city newspaper.
