the Sherman Act, in addition to multiple violations of section seven of the Clayton Act. Both federal acts govern business practices as they relate to antitrust and monopolies. The lawsuit alleges that, over the past decade, Facebook has illegally acquired competitors in a predatory manner and cut services to smaller threats, depriving users from the benefits of competition and reducing privacy protections and services along the way.

“Unfettered by the check-and-balance of competition, Facebook’s unlawful monopoly gives it tremendous power to impose terms and conditions for how its users’ private information is collected, maintained and used to further its business interests,” Schmidt said.

The coalition of attorneys general of 48 states, territories and the District of Columbia is asking the court to halt Facebook’s anticompetitive conduct and block the company from continuing the behavior in the future. The coalition also asks the court to restrain Facebook from making acquisitions in excess of \$10 million without advance notice to the plaintiff states. The court is also asked to provide any additional relief it determines is appropriate, including divestiture or restructuring of illegally acquired companies or current Facebook assets or business lines.

Separately, but in coordination with the multistate coalition, the Federal Trade Commission also today filed a complaint against Facebook in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia.

ORDINANCE No. 589

AN ORDINANCE REGARDING OUTDOOR AND OPEN BURNING ON PUBLIC OR PRIVATE PROPERTY WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF LEOBO, KANSAS

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF LEOBO, KANSAS

SECTION 1: PURPOSE

1.1 This ordinance is intended to promote the public health, safety and welfare and to safeguard the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Lebo, Kansas by regulating the air pollution and fire hazards of open burning and outdoor burning.

SECTION 2: APPLICABILITY

2.1 This ordinance applies to all Outdoor Burning and Open Burning within the City of Lebo, Kansas.

2.2 This ordinance does not apply to grilling or cooking food using charcoal, clean wood, propane or natural gas in cooking or grilling appliances.

2.3 This ordinance does not

apply to burning for the purpose of generating heat in a stove, furnace, fireplace or animal habitation.

2.4 This ordinance does not apply to the use of propane, acetylene, natural gas, gasoline or kerosene in a device intended for heating, construction or maintenance activities.

SECTION 3: SEVERABILITY

3.1 Should any portion of this ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this ordinance shall not be affected.

SECTION 4: DEFINITIONS

4.1 “Clean wood” means natural wood which has not been painted, varnished or coated with a similar material; has not been pressure treated with preservatives; and does not contain resins or glues as in plywood or other composite wood products.

4.2 “Construction and demolition waste” means building waste materials, including but not limited to waste shingles, insulation, lumber, treated wood, painted wood, wiring, plastics, packaging, and rubble that results from construction, remodeling, repair and demolition operations on a house, commercial or industrial building, or other structure.

4.3 “Public Officer/Enforcing Officer” means the Mayor or any authorized Representative of the city.

4.4 “Municipality” means the City of Lebo, Kansas.

4.5 “Outdoor Burning” means open burning or burning in an outdoor wood-fired boiler or patio wood burning unit.

4.6 “Open Burning” means kindling or maintaining a fire where the products of combustion are emitted directly into the ambient air without passing through a stack or a chimney. This includes burning in a burn barrel.

4.7 “Outdoor wood-fired boiler” means a wood-fire boiler, stove or furnace that is not located within a building intended for habitation by humans or domestic animals.

4.8 “Patio wood-burning unit” means a chimney, patio warmer or other portable wood-burning device used for outdoor recreation and/or heating.

4.9 “Refuse” means any waste material, garbage, animal carcasses, and trash or household materials except trees, logs, brush, stumps, leaves and other vegetative matter.

SECTION 5: GENERAL PROHIBITION ON OUTDOOR

BURNING AND OPEN BURNING.

5.1 Except as provided in this Ordinance, Open Burning and Outdoor Burning are prohibited in the City of Lebo.

SECTION 6: OPEN BURNING

6.1 It is unlawful for any person to burn or allow to be burned on his premises or any premises he may lease or control, any trash, rubbish, garbage, or other materials which is not a fuel for heat or cooking.

SECTION 7: PATIO WOOD-BURNING UNITS

7.1 A patio wood-burning unit may be installed and used in the City of Lebo, Kansas only in accordance with all of the following provisions:

7.1.1 The patio wood-burning unit shall not be used to burn refuse.

7.1.2 The patio wood-burning unit shall burn only clean wood.

7.1.3 The patio wood-burning unit shall be located at least 25 feet from the nearest structure which is not on the same property as the patio wood-burning unit.

SECTION 8: LIABILITY

8.1 A person utilizing or maintaining an outdoor fire shall be responsible for all fire suppression costs and any other liability resulting from damage caused by the fire.

SECTION 9: RIGHT OF ENTRY AND INSPECTION

9.1 Upon probable cause of a possible violation of this ordinance, the Public Officer or any authorized officer, agent, employee or representative of the City of Lebo, Kansas may inspect any property for the purpose of ascertaining compliance with the provisions of this ordinance.

SECTION 10: ENFORCEMENT AND PENALTIES

10.1 Violation of this ordinance is a Class “B” misdemeanor and is punishable by a fine of up to \$1,000.00 and for a jail sentence of up to six (6) months.

SECTION 11: EFFECTIVE DATE

11.1 This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the official city newspaper.
