Per a plea agreement, two counts were dismissed, aggravated intimidation of a witness (level 6 person felony) and battery - physical contact in rude, insulting, angry manner (class B person misdemeanor).
 20CR82 (10-8-20) Kyle C. Ivie, Burlington, was sentenced to an underlying 39 months in prison for his conviction of violate Offender Registration Act - first conviction (level 6 person felony). He was granted 24 months of probation with Community Corrections. He must pay \$193 court costs, \$35 fingerprint fee, \$100 BIDS application fee and \$120 corrections supervision fee. The sentence will run consecutive to Case 19CR64 and the probation will run concurrent to the same case. In Case No. 19CR64, Ivie's 36-month probation was revoked. He had been sentenced to an underlying 32 months in prison for his conviction for aggravated battery (level 5 person felony). The court extended Ivie's probation by 36 months and ordered him to serve 60 days in the county jail.
 20CR94 (12-8-20) Haley J. Morris, Burlington, pleaded no contest to possession of marijuana and possession of drug paraphernalia, both class B misdemeanors. The court found her guilty on both counts. She was fined \$100 on each count and sentenced to six months

in the county jail on each count, which was suspended in lieu of 12 months of supervised probation. The sentences are to run concurrently. Per a plea agreement, the state dismissed one count unlawful possession of Oxycodone (level 5 drug felony). Morris must pay \$158 court costs, \$60 supervision fee, \$100 BIDS fee, \$35 fingerprint fee. Also, as part of probation, Morris must obtain an alcohol and drug evaluation and follow any recommendations.
 20CR106 (12-10-20) Dakota D. Joss, Lebo, was sentenced to an underlying 11 months in prison for his conviction of unlawful possession of a controlled substance - methamphetamine (level 5 drug felony). He was placed on 12 months of supervised probation through Court Services. Two counts were dismissed, possession of drug paraphernalia (class B misdemeanor) and criminal damage to property without consent value less than \$1,000 (class B misdemeanor). Joss must pay \$193 court costs, \$200 DNA database fee, \$120 correctional supervision fee, \$100 BIDS application fee and \$35 fingerprint fee.
 20CR119 (10-27-20) Issac C. Sidebottom, Waverly, pleaded no contest to violate protection order - condition of pretrial orders (class A misdemeanor) and criminal damage to property - without consent value under \$1,000 (class B misdemeanor). He was fined \$100 on the first count and sentenced to serve 12 months in the county jail, which was suspended in favor of 12 months of supervised probation after serving a 60-day jail sanction in Case 20CR63. He was sentenced to serve six months in the county jail for the criminal damage count and ordered to pay \$200 restitution. The sentences will run concurrently and consecutive with the sentence in Case 20CR63. Sidebottom must pay \$158 court costs, \$60 supervision fee and \$35 fingerprint fee. As part of a plea agreement, two counts were dismissed: possession of drug paraphernalia (class B misdemeanor) and operate a motor vehicle without a valid license (class B misdemeanor).
 20CR120 (10-20-20) James W. Brown, LeRoy, pleaded no contest

to domestic battery (class B person misdemeanor) and violate protection order - condition of probation (class A person misdemeanor). He was fined \$200 and served two days of a six-month jail sentence, which was suspended. On the second count, he was sentenced to 12 months jail, which was suspended in lieu of 12 months of supervised probation. He must pay \$158 court costs, \$35 fingerprint fee and \$60 supervision fee.
 20CR129 (11-12-20) Cheyenne M. Schurle, Burlington, was sentenced to an underlying eight months in prison for interference with law enforcement officer - falsely report a felony crime intending action on information (level 8 nonperson felony). She was placed on 18 months of supervised probation with Court Services. Schurle must pay \$193 court costs, \$200 DNA database fee, \$35 fingerprint fee, \$120 correctional supervision fee and \$100 BIDS administrative fee.
 20CR161 (12-16-20) Criminal proceedings were stayed against Atraya R. Pierce, Topeka, who entered into a one-year diversionary agreement with the county attorney. She is charged with possession of marijuana upon a roadway and possession of drug paraphernalia, both class B misdemeanors. Pierce must pay a \$50 fine on the marijuana possession, \$158 court costs, \$200 diversionary fee and \$35 fingerprint fee.
